## All Students at CAT Will Receive Chromebooks!

We are very excited to go one-to-one with computers this year! This means that every student at CAT will receive a Chromebook to use at school and bring home each day. This level of technology helps us fulfill our mission of preparing students for college. A computer-use agreement will be sent home detailing the rules around using the Chromebooks as well as information about what happens if it is misused



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or not cared for responsibly. We are very confident that our students will do a great job of taking care of the Chromebooks. This is a great opportunity for all of our students!



#### **CAT Attendance Policy**

The best way for students to learn and be successful is to be at school, everyday, on time. Classes begin at 8:30, so it is important to be here at CAT by at least 8:25. That said, we want to make sure that students and families are aware of the attendance policy.

First, it is important to know some of the basic definitions and attendance codes.

**TT - Tardy Truant -** A student is coded with a TT is they are over 30 minutes late to school.

**AU - Absent Unexcused -** If a student does not come to school and we do not have information as to why, it counts as an unexcused absence.

**PE - Parent Excused -** If a family member or guardian calls in and let's us know that the student will not come in, it counts as Parent Excused. The confusing parts here is that the state of California will not let us excuse the absence without a note, so it still counts like an AU unless we have a doctor's note.

**AE - Absence Excused -** An absence that is excused by a doctor's note, a funeral, or a court appointment does not count toward the total number of absences that a student has. AEs are fully excused.

So what is the actual policy? TTs, AUs, and PEs all add up to the total number of tardies and absences that a student has. Students will be called for every tardy truant or absence.

Different interventions occur as the number increases

**5 Absences or Tardies -** Letter home, meeting with student

**10 Absences or Tardies** - Letter home, individual meeting and attendance contract

**15 Absences or Tardies** - Letter home, warning of upcoming School Attendance Review Board (SARB) meeting

**20 Absences or Tardies** - Letter home, SARB meeting at Envision Schools officeis in Oakland

More information will be shared about this throughout the school year. Overall, we want
